Of course there are a variety of reasons which support the argument. Yet most of them don't have much to do with what a wonderful and ancient language it is. The prominent ones include it as a library language, as well as the language of finance and business, law and most of the entertainment industry.

The tendency of borrowing aggressively from other languages enriched vocabulary of English to a large extent, which is suffused with synonyms and homophones. This receptiveness make the wordplay and rhyme scheme a delight along with the language techniques like assonance, alliteration etc.

William Shakespeare -- The Greatest Dramatist



William Shakespeare was born on April 23, 1564, in Stratford-upon-Avon as the son of John Shakespeare and Mary Arden. He was educated at the King Edward VI Grammar School in Stratford, where he learned Latin and a little Greek and read the Roman dramatists. At eighteen, he married Anne Hathaway. During his time in London, Shakespeare's first printed works were published. They were two long poems, 'Venus and Adonis' (1593) and 'The Rape of Lucrece' (1594). He also became a founding member of The Lord Chamberlain's Men, a company of actors. Shakespeare was the company's regular dramatist,

producing on average two plays a year for almost twenty years. Altogether Shakespeare's works include 38 plays, 2 narrative poems, 154 sonnets, and a variety of other poems. No original manuscripts of Shakespeare's plays are known to exist today.

It is actually thanks to a group of actors from Shakespeare's company that we have about half of the plays at all. Shakespeare's legacy is as rich and diverse as his work; his plays have spawned countless adaptations across multiple genres and cultures. His plays have had an enduring presence on stage and films. His writings have been compiled in various iterations of The Complete Works of William Shakespeare, which include all of his plays, sonnets, and other poems. William Shakespeare continues to be one of the most important literary figures of the English language. Shakespeare's success in the London theatres made him considerably wealthy, and by 1597 he was able to purchase New Place, the largest house in the borough of Stratford-upon-Avon. Although his professional career was spent in London, he maintained close links with his native town. His famous works include Hamlet, Romeo and Juliet, Othello, Macbeth and King Lear--all considered to be one of the finest works in English language. He died in Stratford -upon-Avon on 23 April 1616 at the age of 52 and was buried in the Parish Church in Holy Trinity.

We should not use "good" to describe a verb. Instead we should use "well" to describe a verb. English is so tricky. Instead of feeling pride in our attempt, we feel ashamed of our grammatical mistakes. Making grammatical mistakes when we speak or write is a nature of learning the language.

Grammar is the building blocks of any language and necessary for us to convey what we have to say properly. In order to improve our pronunciation skills, learning grammar is essential. Knowing grammar will help us to avoid errors. Correct grammar is our key to speak English fluently and confidently.

Do native speakers speak grammatically correct???? No.... Now think about ourselves and native language Malayalam. People don't know how to explain a lot of grammar rules. Sometimes we misplace the words while speaking. If something is said grammatically incorrect, it sounds weird to us and too formal.

There are certain rules for formal writing and informal writing. When we write an essay, we have to stick to the rules of formal writings and we have to know the grammar rules. There is a scientific confirmation that spoken language differs from written language and that has to do with the brain and the speed of processing information.

Language develops by social interaction and observation and not by grammar. It must be developed naturally language is like swimming or cycling- you can't learn it by simply reading books. We have to plunge in that, we have to make mistakes, practicing, more use of vocabulary develops your language. This is the right way to develop your English.

Language plays a vibrant role for kids/preschoolers. They listen a lot and they are very attentive. Kids don't doubt about their mistakes. They just express themselves. They mimic the adults all the time repeating the exact words they hear. If you hate learning Grammar, you have to think of yourself as a child and do a couple of things.

Since we don't live in an English speaking country, we have to create this environment in our place of living. We have to create this environment to immerse ourself in the language. Start listening to things spoken in English. Learn new words in English and pronounce those words. Pay close attention to the way that people use English in different life situations.

It is extremely important to repeat all the time what you have learned and what you have heard in your speech, if you don't want to dig into grammar rules. Reapply this knowledge in another situation. This is the way our brain works — it builds connections and associations. So the things you have to keep in mind is attentive listening, repeating, communicating and immersing in the language.

You don't have to memorize all the Grammar rules before you start speaking English. This is important because you need to start speaking to gain confidence, and grammar will come overtime.

So start speaking English as soon as possible without worrying about grammar.
