The health of each and every child is important hence it is a vital fact to ensure that they get the sufficient nutrients from the diet.


The Olympics



The Olympic Games are the world's leading sports event. Athletes from more than 200 countries compete in them. The Olympics include the Summer Games and the Winter Games. Each is held in a different country once every four years. Until the early 1990s the Summer and Winter Games were held in the same year. Today they are separated by two years.

Ancient Olympics

Although the ancient Games were staged in Olympia, Greece, from



776 BC through 393
AD, it took 1503 years for the Olympics to return. The first modern Olympics were held in Athens, Greece, in 1896. The man responsible for its rebirth was a

Frenchman named Baron Pierre de Coubertin, who presented the idea in 1894. His original thought was to unveil the modern Games in

1900 in his native Paris, but delegates from 34 countries were so enthralled with the concept that they convinced him to move the Games up to 1896 and have Athens serve as the first host.

Tokyo Olympics have begun (July 23) after a year-long delay due to the Covid-19 pandemic.

For the second time in its history, Tokyo is hosting the summer Olympics; they first hosted back in 1964. Tokyo is the first city in Asia to host an Olympics twice.

About 22 athletes and six officials from India are attended the opening ceremony for the Tokyo Olympics 2021 at the National Stadium.

India made a remarkable position in Tokyo Olympics compared to the previous ones. India bagged a total of 7 medals having one Gold two Silver and four Bronze.

(OVEP) is a practical set of learning resources designed to inspire and allow young people to experience life values such as excellence, respect and friendship.

Koh-i-Noor

Bringing back the Kohinoor

"A Star of London's Crown Jewels, the Indian gem has a bloody history of colonial conquest."

The koh-i-noor diamond is one of the largest and most famous cut diamonds in the world. It was most likely found in southern India between 1100 and 1300. The name of the stone is Persian meaning 'Mountain of Light' and refers to its astounding size - originally 186 carats. [Today 105.6]

The diamond came from India's alluvial mines thousands of years ago sifted from the sand. According to Hindu belief, it was revered by gods like Krishna – even though it seemed to carry a curse if the luck of its owners was anything to go by.



It was later acquired by Delhi Sultan Allauddin Khilji. The diamond was also part of the Mughal Peacock Throne. In its long history, the stone has changed hands many times, almost always into the possession of male rulers.

In 1849, after the conquest of the Punjab by the British forces, the properties of the Sikh Empire were confiscated. The koh-i-noor was transferred to the treasury of the British East India Company in Lahore. Today, the diamond is on public display in the jewel house at the Tower of London.
